5.1 Parents' committee - Old Mill Park

The Old Mill Park parents' committee and the recreation department will be working together on the planning of different activities to be held at the Old Mill Park. Members of the parents' committee will appoint a single contact person to share information or submit any kind of request to the recreation department, more specifically Nicole Trudeau, the director.

The activities coordinated and implemented by the parents' committee will have to coordinate with the activities organized by the recreation department in order to avoid conflicts with other activities, among other conflicts.

Mrs Jeanne Charlebois asks Benoît Crête to submit a written document to the recreation department, that shows the different activities the committee wishes to organize.

Applications for financial support for implementing different activities organized by the Old Mill Park parents' committee will be submitted to different organizations such as Rotary Club, Knights of Columbus and the Royal Canadian Legion.

Nicole Trudeau informs members that instructors will be present in each park this summer, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., from Monday to Friday, inclusively.

8. Recreation Facilities

8.1 Opening of the Robert-Hartley Sports Complex - public holidays

In the spring of 2018, a recreation planning survey was conducted with citizens and visitors who use the recreational services of the Town of Hawkesbury. Many respondents noted that public recreation services should be made available during public holidays.

During the Certified Ice Technician training, it was discovered that in order to maintain quality ice conditions in the arena throughout the season, it is necessary to work on the ice for a four (4) to six (6) hour block on a bi-weekly to monthly basis. This maintenance work could be done during the public holidays in order to avoid additional human resources expenses.

Be it resolved to recommend Council to approve the opening of the Robert-Hartley Sports Complex on Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Remembrance Day, Good Friday and Victoria Day, as of September 2018. One maintenance worker, one general labourer, one information desk clerk, one rink monitor and three (3) lifeguards would be required to work on these public holidays. The approximate cost to offer activities during the said public holidays would be \$850 per day.

8.3 Leasing of garden sheds at the Place des Pionniers

Mrs Adriana Risquez of Hawkesbury is interested in leasing one of the garden sheds this summer to sell sandals. Another lady wishes to sell different products made with maple syrup.

All the population of Hawkesbury and outsiders would likely be interested in the pilot project which could be overseen by the Town of Hawkesbury. A \$360 general license would be issued allowing the sale of different products.

Mrs Risquez will make enquiries about small entrepreneurs interested in selling their products in order to make the Place des Pionniers a lively and friendly place. She will submit the proposed activities and the number of participants. She will need an authorization from the Municipality to ensure that the event to be conducted is in accordance with the Town's guidelines and obligations.
